Faculty/Counselor Responsibilities

>Keep a copy of the camper's Allergy Action Plan and IACP in places where the camper primarily participates in Summer Adventures (e.g. designated classroom, lunchroom, gym, etc.)

>Inform parents of the allergic camper in advance of any special events where food will be served.

>Ensure that food or products containing the camper's allergens are not used for projects, science experiments, or celebrations.

>Plan for the following on field trips: ensure the implementation of the Allergy Action Plan and IACP, carry a cell phone to call 911 if needed, and review the Allergy Action Plan before the field trip.

>Implement accommodations that parent indicated "yes" in parent section.

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Camp Leadership Responsibilities

- >Ensure there are walkie-talkies available to playground and staff running activities in gym and outside.
- >Delegate proper cleaning of the allergen free area in the lunchroom and classroom (when the classroom is used as a lunchroom).
- >Prohibit sharing or trading food at camp.
- >Encourage campers to bring healthy snacks to camp and encourage avoidance of bringing snacks made with nuts.
- >Ensure nut free area is available in lunchroom for camper if parent indicated this is needed (see parent section).

Camp Leadership Responsibilities (continued)

- >Educate all staff that interacts with the camper about food allergy symptoms and the steps required to implement the Allergy Action Plan. Review emergency procedures with counselors prior to field trips as needed.
- >Ensure access to emergency medication when developing plans for fire drills, lockdowns, etc.
- >A copy of the camper's Allergy Action Plan and IACP will be distributed on a need to know basis.
